



Tertiary Placements

Congratulations are extended to the Ivanhoe Girls' Class of 2016 on their tertiary offers. Amazingly 100% of students who were seeking a placement in Victoria received a first round offer, while a number of students also received a second round offer this week! In addition, a number of students have been offered places interstate, both at Australian National University and at various New South Wales universities.

Our 2016 Dux, Madeleine, has been offered a place at Swinburne University of Technology to study Design on a Vice Chancellor's Scholarship. Erin and Victoria have been offered places to study Biomedicine at the University of Melbourne, whilst Olivia B and Glenda have both chosen to study Arts, at Monash and Melbourne Universities respectively. Stephanie has chosen to study Law (Honours)/Science at Monash University (all of whom achieved an ATAR score over 99).

Our 2016 School Captain, Elena has been offered a place to study Law (Honours)/Arts at Monash University, whilst our Vice Captain, Olivia I has chosen to study a flexible double Arts, Social Science, Business and Science degree at the Australian National University in Canberra.

In applying for entry to tertiary study our girls are encouraged to aim high and use their first two preferences for the courses of their dreams. Hence is it very exciting that 86% of students received a place in their first or second preference course, with 92% receiving a place in a course of their first three choices. The clearest picture that emerges is girls choosing their own individual pathways. Whilst a significant number have chosen a broad first degree, such as Arts and Science, prior to any specialisation, each girl has chosen a tertiary placement that suits her interests and planned career path, with 64 differing fields of study being chosen by Ivanhoe Girls' students. This year also continued the trend of a strong representation by students in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths) with 56% of the courses selected being STEAM-based, including: animal and veterinary bioscience; animation; applied science/speech pathology; aviation; biomedicine; design; engineering – civil and infrastructure; food and nutrition science; medicine and science.

Other interesting tertiary destinations that highlight the breadth of the students attending Ivanhoe Girls' include: architecture; beauty therapy; creative writing; fine arts (dance); law (honours)/arts; property and valuation and visual merchandising.
